The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Regents was held at their Office in the Dormitory building on Wednesday October 31, 1894 at 9 A.M. Present: C. E. Mack, J. W. Haines and H. L. Fish, also Dr. Stubbs, President of the University.

Minutes of meetings held October 2nd and 4th were read and approved.

President Stubbs reported at considerable length on University matters including visits to Elko and Carson in the interest of the Institution.

The President of the University was authorized to make such changes in the management and carrying on of the Boarding

Department as he thought for the best interests of the students.
