It was moved and carried that the appointment of a Professor to fill the Chair of Pedagogy be deferred and Mrs. Mary W. Emery be appointed to fill the position temporarily.

On the recommendation of Acting President Thurtell, Mrs. Maude
Wheeler was appointed Instructor in German and Mathematics at a
salary of Seventy Five dollars per month from September 1, 1902.
This appointment and salary to continue as long as her full services are required in the University.

On the recommendation of President Stubbs, the Board authorized the employment of Joseph Alfred Williams to teach the Class in Second Year High School, Department of English for the Fall term at the salary agreed upon by Dr. Stubbs with Mr. Williams.

The resignation of Ada Edwards as Instructor of Hygiene and Physical Training was received and, upon motion, accepted.

The Chairman of the Board was authorized to purchase a die for punching catalogues and for the use by the Librarian.

The resolution of the Miners Union of Virginia City was received and ordered spread upon the minutes.
